## **RE: Changed Restrictions 5 August 2021**

Please note that as at, **12:01am Thursday 5 August 2021**, the following restrictions will apply to licensed Clubs.

These restrictions will be reassessed in seven days.

- **Indoor and outdoor densities will be at 1 person per 2m<sup>2</sup> (50%).** Capacities are based on the size of the club. Eg if a club has an area of 400m<sup>2</sup> then 200 patrons (excluding staff) are permitted;
- The consumption of food and beverages continues to be **permitted both indoors and outdoors but must be done while seated. Still no seated consumption of food or drink at the bar;**
- The wearing of masks remains mandatory at all “indoor public places” which includes Clubs, with the following exceptions:
  - The person is eating or drinking;
  - The patron is under 12 years of age;
  - The patron (or staff member) has a relevant medical exemption. (Evidence of the medical condition must be produced upon request);
  - The staff member is carrying out functions where it is not possible to properly carry out those functions. For example, “back of house” staff such as chefs and kitchen hands must wear masks, but only where it is practical to do so. For example masks do not need to be worn if it is making it difficult to carry out work. This also applies to workers engaged in physical exertion such as those unloading supplies/pallets, where the wearing of a mask would be an impediment.
- **Team, club and competitive sports will be permitted.** No spectators unless the person is present as a “caregiver”. This will mostly apply to junior sports. Staff and trainers aren’t considered spectators;
- TAB, Bingo, 8ball, darts etc continue to be permitted **with 8ball and darts competitions to be permitted from 12:01am Thursday;**
- Gaming will continue to be permitted, however at 50% densities;

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- Takeaway services continue to be permitted;
- No dancing apart from bridal waltzes;
- No singing indoors by the public, however singing may occur indoors if the singers are performers and they are performing or rehearsing (excludes persons singing at karaoke). Anyone is permitted to sing outdoors.

All other COVID obligations such as QR codes and COVID Marshals remain unchanged.

As always, once the latest SAPol Direction has been released Clubs SA will analyse it and provide a further update
